

PROVINCIAL NEONATAL RESUSCITATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE TERMS OF REFERENCE

1.0 PURPOSE

To identify and promote current standards of neonatal resuscitation.

To provide advice and leadership for the planning, implementation, evaluation, and reporting for the Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) in British Columbia (BC).

VISION STATEMENT

All newborn infants are provided with immediate and skilled resuscitation that is consistent across BC and Canada and has its foundation on national and provincial evidence based guidelines.

2.0 AUTHORITY

- 2.1 The co-chairs of the committee will report to and are accountable to Perinatal Services BC (PSBC) through PSBC's Leadership [or Steering] Committee.
- 2.2 Operationally, the committee will be responsible to the Executive Director, PSBC.

3.0 MANDATE

- 3.1 To promote and support the development, dissemination and maintenance of a standardized NRP for British Columbia
- To ensure Regional Instructor Trainers (RIT) are identified and trained to meet national standards established by the Canadian Paediatric Society (CPS) and the PSBC NRP RIT role and responsibilities document.
- 3.3 To advise the PSBC's Leadership Group on matters related to neonatal resuscitation.
- 3.4 To provide input in the development of reports on neonatal resuscitation by linking education with clinical outcomes.
- 3.5 To respond to NRP concerns expressed by providers and instructors within British Columbia.
- To review the instructor pool and advise on ways to recruit new instructors, maintain their participation and on-going competencies.
- 3.7 To establish relationships of consultation and collaboration with perinatal care providers, professional organizations, and other stakeholders to share information and expertise related to neonatal resuscitation and NRP.
- 3.8 To represent BC, through its co-chairs or designate(s), at the CPS NRP Steering Committee.

4.0 MEMBERSHIP

The Provincial Neonatal Resuscitation Advisory Committee is a multidisciplinary committee of experts who are NRP Regional Instructor Trainers, NRP Instructors and administrators representing PSBC and the Health Authorities. This Committee will consist of:

- Co-Chair Neonatologist or Pediatrician (Medical Lead BC NRP). Must be a current NRP Regional Instructor Trainer
- Co-Chair Outreach Coordinator, Neonatal PSBC
- Provincial Lead Education and Quality PSBC
- NRP Representative from the Yukon
- NRP Regional Instructor Trainers from BC
- Representation from health authorities which do not have a Regional Instructor Trainer, who must be a current NRP Instructor
- Regional NRP Coordinators
- Representation from Perinatal Leads
- Other allied health representation who are current NRP Instructors: Family Practice, Midwifery, Respiratory Therapy

MEMBERSHIP ACCOUNTABILITY

Each member is expected to:

- Report to the Provincial Committee about the provision of NRP in individual health authorities.
- Attend a minimum of 75% of committee meetings
- Review/revise documents as requested.
- Participate in discussions and recommendations, and other committee activities.
- Share recommendations and information from the Committee back to their respective health authorities.

5.0 MEETINGS

- 5.1 Meetings will be held at least four (4) times per year and at the call of the Co-Chairs.
- 5.2 PSBC will ensure scheduling of meetings, distribution of the agenda, and recording of the minutes.
- 5.3 Decisions are made through consensus. If consensus cannot be reached, decisions will be made through voting with a simple majority including by email.
